General Manager's report

- Tom reported that the spring membership drive in March raised about \$44,000 but fell short of its goal. The next pledge drive runs June 13-26.
- The manager also announced that KSER has received a \$5,000 grant from the Tulalip Tribes.
- The station's CD players are being replaced for the on-air studio at a cost of about \$1,500.
- The parking lot next to the station building has been converted to a pay lot by its owner. He is researching possibilities for other places that staff can park and/or a trade agreement with the lot owner.
- The manager also reviewed the station's account balances for the month.

New business

- Erin moved to approve the minutes for the March board meeting. Sam seconded, and the minutes were approved 6-0.
- Tom reported that no rental pavilions are available at Forest or Legion parks this summer, so the volunteer picnic may have to make do without one. He said he'd check on covered shelter availability at McCollum Park and/or the Floral Building at Forest Park.
- Tom and the board discussed the future of the Voice of the Community Awards event, including
 whether to make it an on-air-only event. There was no consensus, though Erin and Maire said it
